

Track Championships in February, Erin was seeded 27th in the entire state in the 200m with a time of 25.85 seconds. She finished in 12th place with a time of 25.85 seconds," said her mother, Diane McMullin.

"This has to be an encouraging outcome for the current N.A.G.S. track team," said Erin's mother, who established the N.A.G.S. Track team when she began coaching Erin's sister **Jessica**, '88. 



NATIONAL ASSESSMENT OF EDUCATIONAL PROGRESS (NAEP)

THE NATION'S REPORT CARD

The **Fourth Grade students** of Nazareth Academy Grade School were selected to participate in the **2009 Nation's Report Card** reported by the National Assessment of Educational Progress.

The NAEP is a congressionally mandated project overseen by the National Center for Educations Statistic (NCES) to continuously monitor the knowledge, skills and performance of the nation's children and youth. As the Nation's Report Card, NAEP measures and reports on a yearly basis on the American's students comprehension in core subjects such as reading, mathematics, writing and science.

NAEP selects samples representing the broad spectrum of nonpublic schools in Grades 4, 8 and 12. "Non-public schools represent 24% of schools in the nation and educate nearly 11% of the students. In order to have a complete picture of the academics progress of the nation's students, both public and non-public school students must participate in NAEP.

The test was administered by the NAEP team on February 23, 2009. Nancy Ashe, NAEP Team Coordinator, stated, *"The atmosphere at Nazareth Grade School is extremely positive. We were impressed by the many awards your students have earned. The administration's commitment to the students and school are apparent to visitors."*

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The Merck Institute for Science Education was founded in 1992 to contribute to science education of children in kindergarten through eighth grades. We are fortunate that Mrs. Julia Roberts, a Merck employee, enthusiastically brings fascinating science experiments to Nazareth every year.

This year, the Merck Science Kit project featured a handmade rocket that had the potential to soar to new heights! Using simple materials such as a sheet of paper, tape, a film canister and an Alka-Seltzer tablet, the students created their own missile. One by one, water was placed in the "fuel tank" with the tablet, and the rockets were set to launch. With the creation of carbon dioxide, the gas exploded, which propelled the rocket upward.





The project demonstrated the

principles of chemistry and physics, as some of the missiles hit the ceiling, flying a distance of 11 feet!

We are grateful to Merck for their partnership and commitment to elementary school science education. We are equally grateful to Mrs. Roberts and assistants Mr. Jim Roberts, parents of Ava, Gr. 5 and Chloe, Gr. 3, and our faculty for their time and effort in teaching this lesson at N.A.G.S.
















THE WAY OF THE CROSS

On April 6 and 7, 2009, students in Grade 8 performed a series of tableaux, one for each of the 14 Stations of the Cross depicting the crucifixion of Jesus. During the two performances, there were few empty pews in the High School Chapel, as families and fellow students gathered to watch Jesus'

MANYA PEREL : PORTRAIT OF A SURVIVOR

Manya Frydman Perel, a survivor of the Holocaust, visited March 25, 2009 to speak with the eighth grade class. This is the second time Mrs. Perel has been to Nazareth to bear witness to the catastrophic annihilation of the Jews during World War II.

As a teenager in Radom, Poland, she attended a public school and hoped to go to college. Her hopeful plans for the future were obliterated in September, 1939, when the Nazi army marched into the

city. The German army confiscated homes and businesses and eventually imprisoned all the Jewish people.

"I am a survivor of eight concentration camps," stated Mrs. Perel. As our students listened intently, she explained, "I suffered humiliation, torture and hunger just because I was a born a Jew. I lost my parents and most of my family, but it was my destiny to survive the Holocaust. Since the war, I have dedicated my life to bearing witness to young and old."

Despite poor living conditions, scarce rations of food, and constant threat of the gas chambers, Mrs. Perel risked her life to save others. Her bravery, in the face of such destitution, is an inspiration to others.



During a death march, Mrs. Perel and a friend escaped into a forest and waited until they were liberated by the Russian army on May 5, 1945. Later, she married, moved from Montreal to Philadelphia, raised a family and is a proud grandmother. Her family has promised to take over her task and carry on her legacy from generation to generation. She said, "I hope that my life will be an example for others not to take life for granted, not to be prejudiced toward others, and to respect one another. After all, we only have one life to live."
