## Long after we've said our good-byes, our hearts will remember.



Family, friends and colleagues mourned the loss of Kathleen Smith, who passed away on February 11, 2010.

While many tears were shed, there were also many

smiles as groups gathered to console each other with their fond memories of the beloved teacher.

At the age of 60, Mrs. Smith died after a courageous battle with cancer for several years. During her teaching years at NAGS, Mrs. Smith set an example for us all by putting everything she had into becoming a passionate and inspirational teacher through her commitment and high standards.

She was a wonderfully gifted teacher of deep faith who inspired students to explore their growing relationship with God and encouraged them be open and *listen for signs of His plans for them.* 

Throughout the past 18 years at NAGS, Mrs. Smith taught Fourth Grade, Fifth Grade, Eighth Grade and Math. Most recently, she was the upper grades' Social Studies teacher as well as the Eighth Grade Homeroom teacher who had mastered the art of fully preparing our graduates for their transition to high school. She was also the driving force behind the award-winning Forensics Program at the grade school, along with NAGS parent Phyllis Bevilacqua. In neighboring school communities, Mrs. Smith's influence in the promoting Forensics was felt far and wide, so much so that all schools hosting Forensics Tournaments dedicated their competitions in her memory this year.

Mrs. Smith is survived by her husband Dave, daughter **Amanda**, '90, and sons **David**, '92, and **Bryant**, '95, and a large extended family. She was also the proud Mom-Mom of grand-children Violet and Lenny.

As the community remembers this wonderfully gifted teacher, they think of her smile, her sense of calm, her positive attitude and love for her family and friends. Ginny and Randy Smith, Kathy's sister-in-law and brother-in-law wrote, "Kathy was a wonderful teacher and a lovely person. We know your school community cherished her, as did her family, and that you will find a way to keep her memory alive."

We at Nazareth are inspired by the generosity of The Smith Family who have designated contributions to the grade school in Kathleen's memory. The outpouring of sympathy, prayers and support continues to be overwhelming.

After consulting with David Smith and his children, a well-thought out plan has been implemented to benefit the school's academic programs, the forensics program and library. Our plans include:

The dedication of the 8th Grade Classroom and a "Story Telling Chair" in Mrs. Smith's memory, that will be unveiled in the library. The library will also be enhanced with a new section of classics and literary works, as well as Forensics materials.

Several hands-on interactive globes, maps and atlas sets purchased in Mrs. Smith's memory will augment the Social Studies curriculum throughout the school.

Also, three Forensic Scholarships will be presented to current students who demonstrate enthusiasm and improvement in the public speaking extra-curricular activity.

All of our students will continue to benefit from the many heart-felt donations made in Mrs. Smith's memory. Her presence will be missed but her spirit will remain alive through the teachers and students she has inspired, and through those who will continue to learn from her legacy at NAGS.




