Our school's environment is the thread that connects the multitude of activities that take place every day. In a reflection written by Jennifer for the benefit, she stated, "I think one of the things I love most about NAGS is the feeling of Family, which transcends across decades." The faculty "and many others in the Nazareth Family have helped me grow into a strong woman. They taught me love, compassion, perseverance and faith. They may not have understood the impact of what they were doing at the time, but their teachings have blessed my life. "

Jennifer continued, "Every day I am amazed by the kindness and generosity of other people. I am so humbled by the love and kindness I have received from my Nazareth family. It is through the example of Blessed Mary of Jesus the Good Shepherd, the Mother Foundress, that I find my spiritual strength. '*Thy Will Be Done*,' is the Mother Foundress' motto."

We are grateful for the efforts of NAGS parents Bridie Tobler, Kim Gretzula, Bernice Duesler, Sally Unger, Connie Dema as well as Mary Becker, Alpha House Director, who helped organize the event along with the help of parents from NAGS and Alpha House.

Jennifer's bravery in undergoing groundbreaking treatment was a testament to her inner strength and faith. Her devotion to her children and family was an inspiration to us all. We ask our entire school community to join us in a circle of prayer for the Roman and Culp families.

Jump, Jump, Jump! Did you feel a seismic event on the morning of Friday, April 15th? Science moderator Molly Fox directed our NAGS students in *"The Big Jump,"* an experiment that took place in schools, playgrounds and parking lots around the Philadelphia area from 11:00 to 11:01 A.M.

To participate in the event sponsored by the Philadelphia Science Festival, students around the city continuously jumped for one minute. Standing by to measure any seismic activity were scientists at Temple University Seismograph at the Ambler Campus.

A seismic event occurs when seismic waves are detectable. The waves travel through the earth as a result of an earthquake, explosion or some other geologic process.

Although the experiment did not trigger a seismic event, *The Big Jump* was a success in that it drew attention to the collaborative nature of science and what can happen when students share a common interest in investigating a scientific question.



Ready, Set... Read! READING OLYMPICS
