Sr. Mary Ellen is the former Principal of Academia del Perpetuo Socorro in Puerto Rico. Sr. Mary Ellen's many years in education and school administration will positively impact student achievement and growth and provide guidance in implementing plans for the future. We also welcomed new faculty members, a new first grade class and 14 students transferring into various grades.

The goals we continue to set to expand academic opportunities for our students are being met to give all a chance to succeed. An Honors ELA program has been implemented, along with enhanced Science Lab instruction. Resources have been allotted to provide for the increased presence of a school nurse to ensure the well-being of our students.





The campaign for Phase One, which ran from 2002 through 2006, was an ambitious initiative that resulted in the construction of an addition that provided classrooms for Honors Math, Science, Music, Small Group Learning and office space.

The three-panel design is proudly displayed in the first-floor hallway of the new wing as we proudly salute all those who made this project a reality! It is through the commitment of many dedicated individuals that our students benefit from the expansive and inviting classrooms that exist today.

Sr. Mary Ellen presided over the ceremony, along with the Student Council Officers. At a cost of \$1.5 million, the expansion has served as a stepping stone for teachers in meeting the academic goals in serving our students.

Several designs were considered over the past few years and a custom design by Dave Quaresima of Blue Ribbon Awards was finally chosen. Sadly, Quaresima never saw his vision become a reality due to his sudden passing. We thank John Scarpella of Keystone Recognition for stepping in to complete the project.



Following the classroom activities, the students and their guests enjoyed refreshments and toured the classrooms. An event of this magnitude would not be possible without our parent volunteers whose gracious help made our grandparents and older friends feel welcome. We also salute Sr. Mary Ellen, our faculty and staff and the Student Council for their assistance on this special day. Lastly, we thank the 210 grandparents and older friends for traveling distances and taking the time to spend quality time with our students.

Nazareth Always Always Gives Gives Service Service

Nazareth Academy Grade School faculty and students find great satisfaction in planning and participating in community service events. Properly implemented, service learning projects develop citizenship, responsibility and many other positive virtues making this a highly effective character education program in and of itself. NAGS partners with many institutions, organizations and corporations to further the message of the school's mission statement.

Located in a poverty-stricken area of Philadelphia, **St. Francis Inn** is a soup kitchen run by the Franciscans that serves 150,000 meals per year. Nazareth families provide their meals in the form of brown bag lunches on a monthly basis. Prior to the start of school, students line up assembly-line fashion and prepare healthy lunches that are distributed to guests. Lunches are also prepared at home by younger students. This project leads students to an understanding that they are helping by responding to people's immediate needs and strengthening the St. Francis Inn community.

The **Thanksgiving Basket Drive** is a worthy effort organized by the Student Council. Under the direction of moderator and fifth grade teacher Mai Dang, the council members encourage the specific donations needed to make traditional Thanksgiving feasts. Over twenty baskets were delivered to the needy at home, as well as to a local public school in Bensalem, PA. Delivering the baskets is an overwhelming experience in seeing the eyes of parents and children well up in appreciation.

One of our students' favorite projects to participate in is the tie blanket effort for the Woodstock Family Shelter in North Philadelphia. Our parents purchase the required materials and the cutting and tying begins! The project organized by NAGS parent Bridie Tobler, (pictured top right, on left, with Patti Bozarth) yields over 120 cozy blankets for the women and children residing in the shelter. Along with the assistance of art teacher Maria Sheehan, the students show their empathy and love by creating bright and colorful gifts of love for the needy.


