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


The students turned reporters took to the beat around school to interview students and staff about activities, sports competitions and school events.

#### E.I.T.C + FOUNDATIONS = SUCCESS

Since the Children's Scholarship Fund Philadelphia (CSFP) was formed 13 years ago, the organization alone has provided \$61,185.00 in scholarships for tuition for Nazareth Academy Grade School families. Funding is provided by corporate tax dollars through the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program and through dedicated efforts of the CSFP staff. We are proud to maintain this successful and beneficial partnership with the organization to

help families afford a quality Catholic-based education at Nazareth Academy Grade School.

On November 15, 2013, CSFP held a kick-off at Citizens Bank Park for their application process for a lottery. Qualifying students residing in Philadelphia in kindergarten through grade eight were eligible to apply. Once chosen in the lottery, families are granted four consecutive years of assistance provided they qualify.

The organization is supported by many local organizations and corporations, including The Philadelphia Phillies and Wawa, both of whom sent their special "ambassadors" to greet the crowds! The *Phillie Phanatic* and Wawa's *Wally the Goose* provided their own unique and hilarious entertainment at the event.



### A HAIR Raising Experience

A hair-raising experience was had by all on October 9, 2013 with Julia Roberts from Merck Pharmaceuticals. The lesson presented by Mrs. Roberts on the Van de Graaff generator brought an electrifying experience to our Science Lab!

A Van de Graaff generator is an electrostatic generator which uses a moving belt to accumulate very high amounts of electrical potential on a metal globe on a pedestal. The generator was invented by American physicist Robert J. Van de Graaff in 1929. The potential difference achieved in modern Van de Graaff generators can reach 5 megavolts. A tabletop version can produce 100,000 volts and can store enough energy to produce a visible spark and create enough static electricity to raise the hair of our students!

We salute Merck Pharmaceuticals and Julia Roberts, mother of Ava Roberts, '13 and Chloe Roberts, '14, for igniting the spark of Science in the minds of our students over many years. We are grateful for Mrs. Roberts' dedication and time in sharing exciting and amazing scientific matters at NAGS!



It is through projects such as this that the true spirit of the NAGS family shines. God bless all of our service men and women, veterans and their loved ones.


### DESIGNER BAG B-I-N-G-O!
