Raise the Standards

Raising the standards of education is the norm at Nazareth Academy Grade School. The theme of this year's Catholic School's Week set the tone to celebrate the values-centered and faith-driven education that our students receive.

The activities, organized by the Student Council and moderator Mrs. Mai Dang and faculty members, featured a mix of events focused on faith, academics, cultural pride, service, school choice and school spirit.

The St. Francis Inn Brown Bag lunch effort for the homeless launched a day of service on Monday. In addition, diapers and baby formula for both the Inn and Blessed Margaret Castello Home were collected. Breakfast bags were assembled for "Aid for Friends," students visited nursing homes and collected soda-tabs for Children's Hospital. Later in the day, students wrote encouraging letters and cards to promote vocations.

A "Cultural Pride Day" was observed as students wore costumes and colors of their culture and ancestry. Learning the country and nationality represented by each student and faculty member was enlightening for all. Members of the faculty and staff were recognized by the Principal for their role in helping raise the school's standard of academic excellence.

Later in the week, grades one through eight shared their chosen "Homeroom Song" to kick off NAGS Appreciation Day. *Pictured at right and below:* A school spirit Pep Rally and *Nuke 'Em* game raised the noise-level in the Multi-Purpose Room to an all-time high! The eighth grade students were triumphant in a series of games against the faculty and staff.

Student Appreciation Day featured a Denim Dress Down Day, benefitting the Sister M. Celeste Scholarship Fund. Added to the day's festivities was Buddy Bingo and treats from Principal Sr. Mary Ellen. Throughout the week, students explored their faith with a "Religion Question of the Day" and "Religion Quizzo."

Concluding the week was a First Friday Liturgy followed by an Open House and Program of Excellence. Parents, family and friends were in attendance for a student exhibition in Spanish, Forensics, Spelling, choir, choir chimes and musical instruments.

NAZARETH PARTNERS WITH SEPTA





The day before Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA) was set to introduce a new safety campaign, students at Nazareth Academy Grade School were treated to a sneak preview on April 29, 2013. The presentation was made courtesy of Fran Kelly, AP, '04 and SEPTA Assistant General Manager of Government and Public Affairs.

The national safety campaign, "Operation Life Saver," was launched at NAGS by Scott Sauer, *SEPTA* Director of System Safety, at two assemblies with our students. The goal of the program is to reduce the number of nationwide rail-related injuries and fatalities.

Through a slide show, video and Q & A session, the students learned the sobering statistics resulting from either trespassing on railway tracks, standing too close to passing trains, or disregarding railroad crossing gates and signs. The students also learned that it takes one mile for a conductor to fully stop a train in an emergency.

Among the many safety tips highlighted in the program is the fact the tracks are for trains, not people.

The event was covered by Tim Furlong of *Channel 10 News* and Paul Nussbaum of the *Philadelphia Inquirer*. We acknowledge the efforts of Fran Kelly in nominating our school to host the "Operation Life Saver" kick-off. We are also grateful to Scott Sauer and Heather Redfern, *SEPTA* Press Officer, for their role sharing the program with our students and faculty.


LET THE GAMES BEGIN!





Jessica Scipione, pictured above on the right, investigated the cleaning potential of natural versus traditional cleaning products. Her experiment involved various types of surfaces such as glass, wood, clothing and a bathtub. Jessica's project won first place in the category of Environmental Science at our Science Fair.
